



What is ACCOUNT?

- Youth led police-monitoring project founded in 2018
- Developed out of Hackney Young People's Stop and Search Monitoring Group (2012)
- Main activities; research, youth outreach, public campaigns, scrutiny meetings, film projects
- Hosted by Hackney Council for Voluntary Service (HCVS)

Participatory Action Research (PAR)

- Direct challenge to ideas of 'expertise'
- Communities have expertise, and can become experts
- Shouldn't be left to powerful institutions to 'create the narrative'


Participatory Action Research (PAR)

- PAR involves training
- Communities decide the goals, the focus, the aims and reasons for research
- Focus on the change they want to see

Research report



- Report structured around a series of 'challenges' to policing raised by young people
- Used interviews, statistics and other data

Section 1: Trauma

Section 2: Trust

Section 3: Accountability





Why is research important?

- Provide young people with skills to be independent
- Genuine empowerment creates a legacy
- Utilise skills, passion and knowledge already in the room
- ► Flips the balance young people in community can shape the narrative
- Not just useful for 'lived experience'
 -- Can create their story on their own terms





How do we challenge systems?

- Easy to complain about one-off cases
- But what if the problem keeps happening again and again?





Case study of 'bad' stop and search

- Young man (18) is stopped by police during a 'Section 60 search'
- Believes he has been racially profiled as a young black man
- No prohibited items are found on him
- Force used against him, including handcuffs, leaving injury to his wrists
- Reports that he would not trust police after the encounter


