Learning report: Summer 2019

Our approach to involving young people from Hammersmith & Fulham in grant-making

The context...

In Summer 2018 we gave out 12 small grants to Young H&F members. We used a panel of charity and youth sector professionals to help with the decision-making process, including reading application forms, scrutinising budgets, scoring, providing feedback and assessing how much should be awarded. We also invited a local young person to participate. After the panel, the young person told us that they found it difficult to contribute to the panel and did not feel comfortable voicing their opinions. We knew we had to rethink how we involved young people in grant-making so that their needs were met throughout... so in 2019 we did things a little differently.

For Summer 2019, we introduced a simplified video applications process.

The involvement of young people was a key theme throughout, with members encouraged to develop ideas alongside the young people they support.

- What will your project do?
- Who is your project for?
- What will your project achieve?
- What difference will your project make to young people in the borough?
- How will you run your project?
- When and where will you run it?
- A brief breakdown of what you would spend the money on
- How will you be sure that your project is inclusive of young people's diverse needs?
- How does it fit in with our priority themes: education, employability, youth justice, mental and physical health.

Why?

We wanted to reduce the time spent by members filling in application forms; rather we focused on hearing from the members and their young people.

We asked them to use their smart phones to create a 2-minute video outlining the what, why, who and when or their project idea.

We wanted to encourage creativity, as well as members' ability to fine tune their 'elevator pitch' for funding.



We wanted to demonstrate our commitment to developing trust-based funding – we already know our members, so we want to see their ideas come to life!

Importantly, we encouraged youth envolvement in creating & editing the video, with the commitment to bring together an all-youth grants panel to make the final decisions.

Feedback

All 8 participants agree that they now have a better understanding of youth services in the borough.

'Thank you for giving the Youth Grants Panel the opportunity to speak and have a say on what we think our borough needs, as well as letting us share our thoughts and opinions on where the funding should go to each of the groups...I liked working as a team and working together to make a decision on the funding'

75% strongly agreed that they had a better understanding of how grants are awarded, with the other 25% mostly agreeing with the statement.

All 8 participants agreed that they felt their needs were taken into consideration in planning for the panel.

One young person has gone on to become a peer researcher for Young H&F.

'Make all of the applicants fully aware of the rules/requirements so that we can make once decision all together'

'It was very useful, however, it would have been helpful to talk more about grants themselves more specifically, rather than the charity sector in general.'

'Have more sessions or have longer time in the sessions. Maybe meet with [the applicants] who we saw in the videos and do a Q&A session with them.'

'Be more physically interactive rather than verbal, like maybe speaking with the applicants rather than watching them on video.'

'I would like there to be more sessions like this because they are really fun and it's good to meet new people!'

'Break down the grants panel into more sessions as there were a lot of charities to consider in one day.'

'I would like there to be more sessions like this so that we can discuss issues affecting young people in more depth.'
